Partnership Brings New Resources

The partnership of The Literacy Alliance and Vincent Village enters its second decade with new resources for adult learners at the St. Hyacinth Learning Center on Holton Avenue. An Internet-enabled computer lab and funds from a Community Development Block Grant will help the agencies serve students in the new program year which begins August 15.

With the lab, Vincent Village residents and Literacy Alliance students are able to search and apply for work, explore community resources, and work on educational resources.

“We upgraded our system in the office,” said Literacy Alliance Executive Director Judith Stabelli, “And moved the seven computers that were replaced to Vincent Village.” The Literacy Alliance is providing the hardware, and Vincent Village is supplying a room to house them and technical support.

As this area’s only transitional shelter available for families with children, Vincent Village works to keep families together while they rebuild their lives. Together, the shelter and The Literacy Alliance provide adult education for residents as well as other adults in the community.

Since 1988, The Literacy Alliance has worked to end illiteracy by teaching adults through learning centers, literacy programs, and tutoring services that empower individuals to succeed at work, at home, and in the community.
